Start of main civil and earthwork between Glenugie and Tyndale for the Woolgoolga to Ballina Pacific Highway upgrade.

The Australian and NSW governments are jointly funding the \$4.36 billion Woolgoolga to Ballina Pacific Highway upgrade. Roads and Maritime Services Pacific Highway Project Office and Pacific Complete are working together to deliver the project.

Roads and Maritime has awarded the main civil and earthwork contract for the upgrade between Glenugie and Tyndale to Seymour Whyte Constructions, which is also building 21 bridges in this area as well. This contractor has already completed the early work for this section of the project.

The civil and earthwork is expected to start in October 2017 and will take about two years to complete, weather permitting.

Work to date

Some of the initial activities for main civils work include:

- Removing vegetation and fencing
- · Building dedicated access and haul roads along the alignment for heavy machinery
- Installing temporary bridges for haulage routes
- Improving intersections along the project
- · Carrying out earthwork including excavating and blasting to build the foundation for the new road
- · Installing drainage and fencing
- Installing environmental management measures including nest boxes, dust monitoring, erosion and sediment controls.


All material for the civil work will be delivered to the required location by trucks using local roads and dedicated haul roads on the alignment. Materials will be moved within the project boundary as much as possible to reduce the number of construction vehicles on local roads.

Access points for heavy vehicles

Access points for heavy vehicles in the Glenugie to Tyndale section include:

- Eight Mile Lane. Glenugie
- Old Six Mile Lane, Glenugie
- Avenue Road, Lavadia
- Wooli Road, Pillar Valley
- · Mitchell Road, Pillar Valley
- Firth Heinz Road, Pillar Valley
- Bostock Road, Pillar Valley
- Somervale Road, Tucabia

- Crowleys Road, Tucabia
- Tucabia Tyndale Road, Tucabia
- Bensons Lane, Tyndale
- Sheehys Lane, Tyndale.



What is involved?

The main civil and earthwork involve building foundations to lift the road height. This also includes building abutments for the new bridges, installing drains and permanent fencing.

We will keep you informed of our progress and notify you in advance of new activities starting.

How will the work affect you?

Our work may be noisy at times and may cause some disturbance from trucks and other heavy machinery. We will carry out dust and noise monitoring throughout this work to minimise the impact of our work, where possible.

Traffic changes

There will be temporary traffic changes to ensure the safety of road users while machinery such as scrapers, trucks and bulldozers move around the site, particularly where the alignment crosses local roads.

From time to time, there may be detours or traffic lane changes in place. Impacted stakeholders will be notified in advance of any proposed changes. This may affect travel times.

Work hours

Typically work will be carried out during the project's approved construction hours, which are



In areas where residents live more than 200 metres from the work area, extended work hours are allowed from Monday to Friday between 6am and 7am and 6pm and 7pm. Nearby residents will be notified at least five working days in advance of any activities scheduled outside of these working hours.
