Woolgoolga to Ballina Pacific Highway upgrade Proposed refinements to the Maclean interchange and access to Townsend and Gulmarrad

Roads and Maritime Services (RMS) is continuing with the 155 kilometre upgrade of the Pacific Highway from Woolgoolga to Ballina.

The Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) was on display for community comment from 12 December 2012 until 18 February 2013. Following community feedback received during the display of the EIS, the project team has developed alternative options to the design of the Maclean interchange and access to Townsend and Gulmarrad.

This update outlines two alternative options and explains how to provide RMS with community feedback on these alternatives.

Access to Townsend and Gulmarrad

RMS is considering two alternative access options (in addition to the original concept design detailed in the exhibited EIS). These two potential options and their assessment are detailed below. Please also refer to the diagrams on page 3.

Current design in the EIS (access via Jubilee Street)

Features:

- Provides a southbound off-ramp and access road into Jubilee Street from the highway upgrade.
- Access into Townsend and Gulmarrad from Maclean and the northbound carriageway of the upgraded highway would be via a two-way access road from the interchange north to Jubilee Street.
- A roundabout at Jubilee Street would connect the southbound highway off-ramp to the twoway access road and access east along Jubilee Street.
- Vehicle access under Jubilee Street to Maclean would be removed, but pedestrian access to Townsend and Maclean would be retained by a pedestrian and cyclist path on Jubilee Street and under the highway.

Benefits:

- Opportunity to use Goodwood Street / Common Road access as alternative in future.
- No impacts to key biodiversity indicators, eg: threatened plant species.

Alternative option 1 – Alternate Goodwood Street access option Features:

- Relocate the southbound off-ramp further south, past Jubilee Street with a direct connection at the interchange roundabout and to Goodwood Street.
- The access road into Townsend would be along Goodwood Street / Common Road to Brooms Head Road. This would require a new local road to be built connecting Goodwood Street to Brooms Head Road.

Benefits:

- Improved pedestrian and cyclist safety as southbound off-ramp is removed from Jubilee Street, removing conflict with traffic.
- Improved access to Gulmarrad, removing through traffic from Jubilee Street, Townsend.
- Relocation of the southbound off-ramp provides an opportunity to refine the boundary to eliminate the impact to the heritage property.

Alternative option 2 - Jubilee Street via alternate southbound off-ramp access option Features:

- Relocate the southbound off-ramp, similar to option two.
- A two-way access road would then connect at the roundabout to provide access to Townsend.
- Southbound motorists accessing Townsend would exit on the off-ramp towards the roundabout and then back north along the access road to Jubilee Street.

Benefits:


- Improved pedestrian and cyclist safety as southbound off-ramp is removed from Jubilee Street, which removes conflicts.
- Opportunity to separate heavy vehicles and local traffic.
- Opportunity to use Goodwood Street / Common Road access as alternative in future.
- Relocation of the southbound off-ramp provides an opportunity to refine the boundary to eliminate the impact to the heritage property.
- No impacts to key biodiversity indicators, eg: threatened plant species.

Next steps

Following community feedback on the alternative options RMS will select a preferred option for the Maclean intersection.

The preferred option will be submitted to Department of Planning and Infrastructure along with other design changes since the EIS display as part of a Preferred Infrastructure Report. The Department will review this report along with submissions made on the EIS to reach a decision on the project.
