Start of work – Bridges between Tallowood Lane, Tucabia and south of Crowleys Road, Tyndale

The Australian and NSW governments are jointly funding the \$4.36 billion Woolgoolga to Ballina Pacific Highway upgrade. Roads and Maritime Services Pacific Highway Project Office and Pacific Complete are working together to deliver the project.

The Woolgoolga to Ballina Pacific Highway project team will start work on building bridges between Tallowood Lane, Tucabia and a private access road which is south of Crowleys Road, Tyndale on 24 October 2017. Building these bridges will take about six months to complete, weather permitting.

Access point for heavy vehicles

Access points for heavy vehicles for construction of these bridges include:

- Somervale Road
- Private access road, south of Crowleys Road.

Work to be carried out

Bridge building work will involve:

- Setting up the site compound and installing project boundary fencing
- Installing additional environmental controls
- Installing crane pads
- Delivering concrete pre-cast bridge pieces on large trucks
- Pouring bridge deck
- Installing barrier and safety screens
- Demobilise from the site.

Work hours

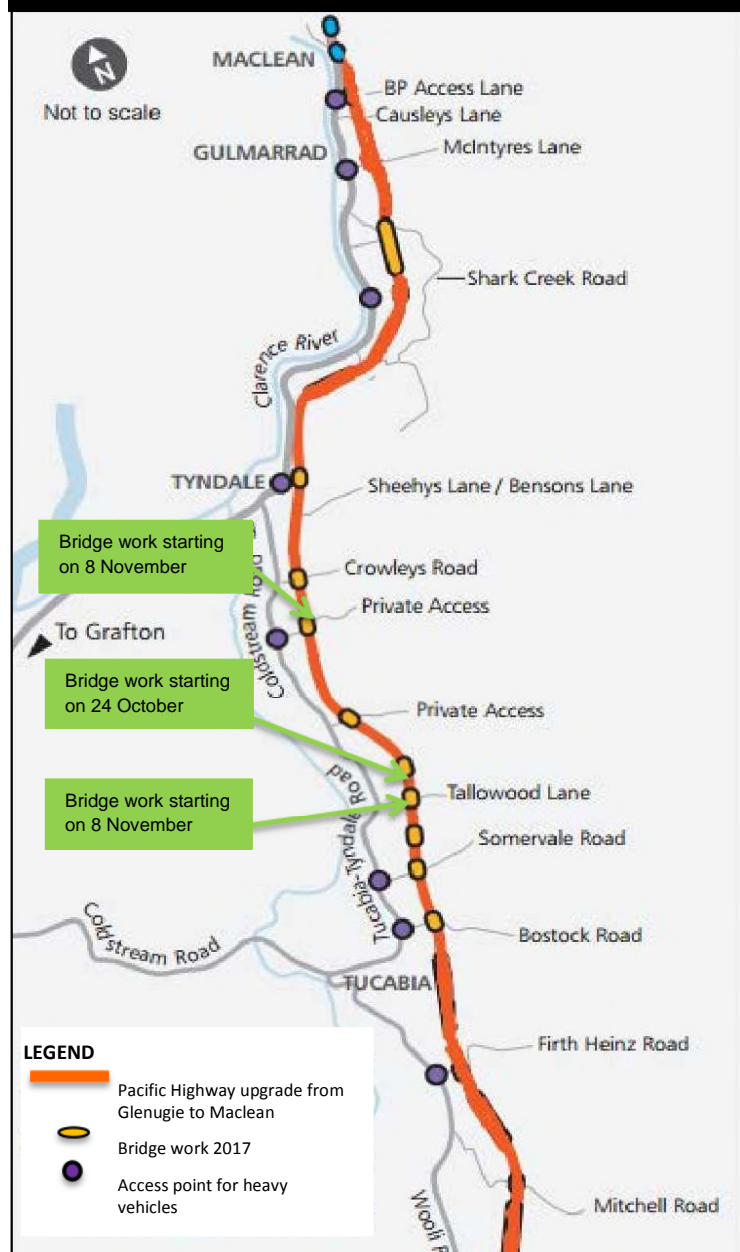
Typically work will be carried out during the project's approved construction hours, which are:



7am – 6pm Monday – Friday
8am – 5pm Saturdays

In areas where residents live more than 200 metres from the work area, extended work hours are allowed between 6am and 7am and 6pm and 7pm from Monday to Friday. Nearby residents will be notified at least five working days in advance of any activities scheduled outside of these working hours.
