Installation of traffic counters and cameras as part of the Coffs Harbour bypass project

The Australian and NSW governments are funding the 14 kilometre Coffs Harbour bypass project. The bypass seeks to improve connectivity, road transport efficiency and safety for local and interstate motorists.

What work is happening?

As part of early work for the Coffs Harbour bypass project, Transport for NSW will soon install a number of traffic counters and cameras throughout Coffs Harbour. The data captured by the counters and cameras will be used to update our traffic surveys and modelling, which will help inform the detailed design of the project.

The cameras will only be used by the project team and are not used by NSW Police for enforcement purposes.

The following installation will occur:

- Intersection turn counters at 71 sites
- Tube counters at 60 sites
- Origin-destination surveys at 11 sites

The cameras and counters will be located at a number of locations throughout Coffs Harbour, including on the existing Pacific Highway, Hogbin Drive and Toormina Road.

How will this work affect you?

Work is expected to start on 1 June and will take three days to complete, weather permitting.

Installation of the tube counters will take about five minutes each counter, while the cameras take about 15-20 minutes each to install.

Work required to install the counters and cameras will depend on the location. For ones located on the Pacific Highway there will be intermittent slow lane closures, while installation on local roads will include short stoppages.

The cameras and counters will begin their surveys on 4 June and collect traffic data for two weeks, after which they will be removed.
