Out of hours work at the northern end of the Coffs Harbour bypass project - September 2022 to July 2023

The Australian and NSW governments are funding the 14-kilometre Coffs Harbour bypass project. The bypass will consist of three interchanges and three tunnels. It will improve connectivity, road transport efficiency and safety for local and interstate motorists.

Quickway has been engaged to continue the early work on the Coffs Harbour bypass project. The early work continues along the northern end of the alignment, with utility relocations of water main, power and telecommunication services being carried out in the Korora region from Bay Drive to Solitary Islands Way.

Most work will occur during standard work hours. Standard work hours are **7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday**, and **8am to 1pm Saturday**. When required for the safety of workers and road users or to minimise traffic delays, out of hours work may occur. In all circumstances, residents will receive written notification before the work starts.

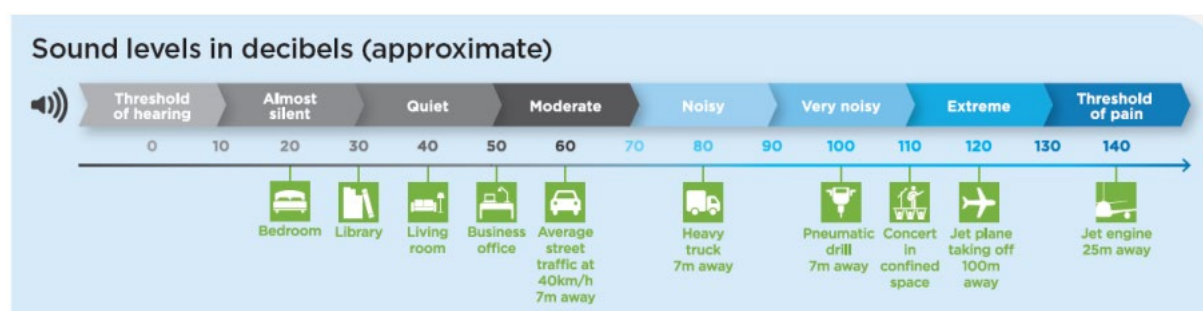

How will this work affect you?

The work will involve the use of machinery which generates noise, light and vibration. We will make every effort to minimise these impacts with our equipment selection, positioning machines and noise blankets, and turning off vehicles when not in use.

Noise levels will vary from moderate to noisy; the diagram below provides a guide to the noise you can expect. Directly affected residents will be contacted and advised of the likely impact and what we are doing to minimise disruption during the work.



Traffic changes

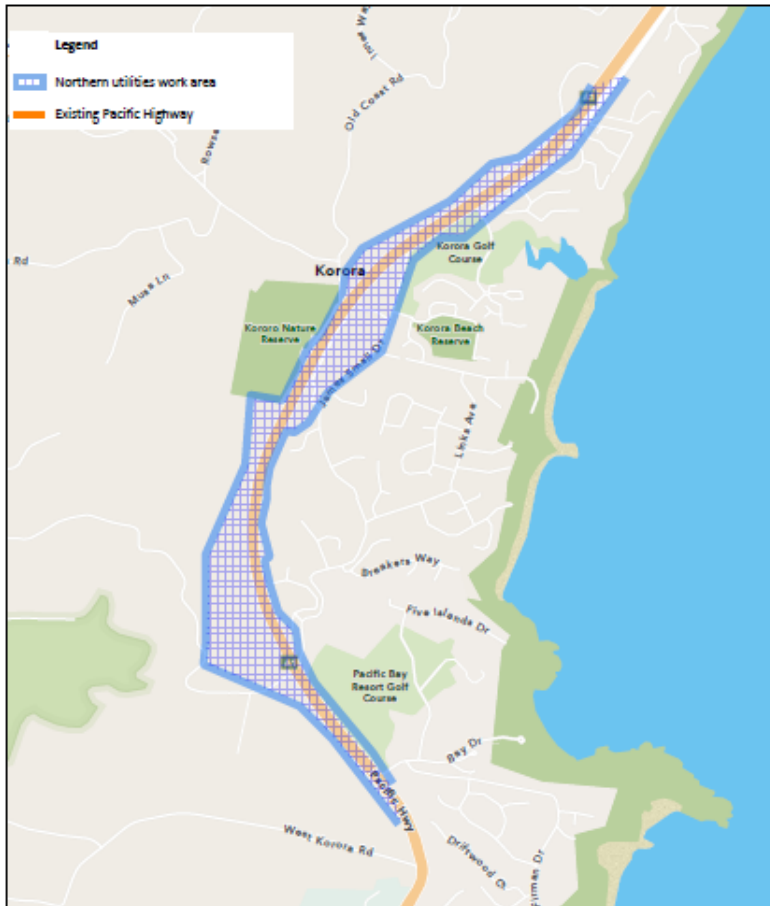
Temporary traffic changes may take place to make sure work zones are safe; this may include changes to speed limits and temporary lane closures. Travel times may be affected.
