


Out of hours concrete pavement at Coramba Road Interchange

Coffs Harbour bypass

September 2024







Transport for NSW acknowledges the Gumbaynggirr people as the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pays respect to Elders past and present.

The Australian and NSW Governments are investing in the 14-kilometre Coffs Harbour bypass project. The bypass will boost the regional economy and improve connectivity, road transport efficiency and safety for all motorists.

What work are we doing?

As part of major construction, the project is continuing to build the Coramba Road Interchange, which includes laying concrete for two roundabouts.

This work will be carried out progressively and involves the delivery, tipping, spreading, compacting and finishing of the concrete subbase and base layers. The finishing process will involve texturing the concrete surface, spraying it with a curing compound, saw cutting the base layer to create joints and treating joints with a silicone sealant.

We have provided a map to show the location of this work.

When we'll be working

We will be carrying out concrete paving from **Monday 30 September 2024** until **March 2025**, weather permitting.

Most concrete pavement activities will be carried out during approved construction hours which are Monday to Friday from 7am to 6pm, and Saturdays from 8am to 1pm.

Due to higher temperatures during spring, summer and autumn, to ensure the integrity of the concrete, some work will be completed outside of approved construction hours being:

- Concrete pours between Monday and Friday from 6am to 7am
- Saw cutting between Monday and Friday from 6pm to 12pm.

What will this mean for you?

Equipment used for this work includes a concrete agitator truck, concrete pump, an elevated work platform, concrete vibrator, concrete saw, hand tools and light vehicles.

The predicted noise level for this work is moderate to noisy. To help explain this, we have included a diagram of comparative noise levels.

Concrete deliveries will be made via the project's approved haulage routes including the Pacific Highway, West High Street and Coramba Road.

Managing our impacts

The Minister's Conditions of Approval (MCoA) for the project sets strict requirements for work outside of approved construction hours and noise, vibration, and dust management.

To ensure compliance and mitigate impacts, we:


- Monitor noise levels, dust and vibration
- Turn off plant and machinery when not in use
- Use non-tonal reversing beepers and instruct workers to keep noise to a minimum
- Position plant and equipment as far from nearby neighbours as possible.

Out of hours construction work

Current and upcoming out of hours construction work in this area includes:

- Delivering and pouring concrete and laying asphalt for temperature, quality and safety reasons
- Sawing concrete
- Delivering machinery and materials and bridge elements using the project's approved heavy vehicle routes
- Installing and relocating signage, line marking and barriers

- Maintaining roads and vegetation and street sweeping
- Carrying out survey, geotechnical and pavement investigations
- Maintaining and refuelling plant and machinery and maintaining internal project haulage routes
- Building and maintaining environmental controls
- Maintaining plant and machinery and refuelling.
